A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF DORAL, FLORIDA AUTHORIZING THE EXTENSION OF THE EXISTING CANAL BANK STABILIZATION PROGRAM AGREEMENT WITH GONZALEZ AND SONS EQUIPMENT, INC. FOR THE PORTION OF YEAR 3 OF THE PROGRAM AS PROVIDED BY THE GRANT FROM THE NATURAL RESOURCES CONSERVATION SERVICE IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$1,178,866.00; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE

WHEREAS, in August 2010, the City awarded Gonzalez and Sons Equipment, Inc. with a contract for Year 1 and Year 2 of the Canal Bank Stabilization Program; and

WHEREAS, on June 28th, 2011, the Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) and the City of Doral executed an agreement providing the City a grant totaling \$1,800,000.00 to fund a portion of Year 2 and Year 3 of this program; and

WHEREAS, Staff respectfully requests that the City Council authorize the extension of the existing agreement with Gonzalez and Sons Equipment, Inc. for the portion of Year 3 of the Canal Bank Stabilization Program as provided by the grant from the NRCS in an amount not to exceed \$1,178,866.00.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL
OF THE CITY OF DORAL AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> The City Council hereby authorizes the extension of the existing agreement with Gonzalez and Sons Equipment, Inc. for the portion of Year 3 of the Canal Bank Stabilization Program as provided by the grant from the NRCS in an amount not to exceed \$1,178,866.00.
