

DORAL PARKS BOND UPDATE

In 2018, the City Council at the time unanimously voted to put out a referendum so that Doral voters could decide if they wanted to invest in parks. The decision was left to the residents and 52.7% of residents said "YES" to improving and building parks and recreational facilities. There is a lot that goes into bringing the ambitious vision of world-class parks to reality that includes conception, design, preconstruction, procurement and construction. Since the passing of the bond the City of Doral has been working with all the necessary parties and agencies to carry out the multiple projects.





Morgan Levy Park Improvements (Completed)

This project included the removal and replacement of existing flooring, new millwork, painting and the addition of a grease interceptor. The addition of ADA accessible routes to the picnic areas, and transitioning to high-efficiency LED fixtures in the parking area as well as adding and enhancing security cameras.

Doral Meadow Park Improvements (Completed)


The project included enclosing the existing outdoor patio space to provide 800 square feet of indoor recreation area with a new HVAC system. In addition, the existing building renovation included a high-tech conference room, a kitchenette, façade treatments, green walls, an indoor trophy case, modernized bathrooms and a multi-purpose outdoor plaza.

BRAND NEW Doral White Course Park (Completed)

This Park is located at 8429 NW 41st Street in Doral, FL. This new park includes a shaded playground, outdoor fitness stations, a multi-purpose green space area, fenced-off dog area, restrooms, and shelters. The park includes landscape lighting with general overhead and walkway lighting and security cameras. It also features a boardwalk that connects this park to the Downtown Doral area.

Doral Cultural Arts Center (Completed)



Doral Central Park (Under Construction)





Doral Central Park is located at 3000 NW 87th Avenue and is the flagship project of the Doral Parks Bond. This 78 acre park will be one of the largest parks in the region and include state-of-the-art amenities like an indoor recreational facility, and aquatics venue with a competition pool, practice swim pool, and recreational splash park area. Outdoor amenities will include walking paths, tennis, basketball, and volleyball courts, (2) two ballfields, picnic areas and pavilions, skate park and pump track and sensory playscape/nature area. Additional activities that will take advantage of the lake are a wetland trail, canoe/(remove) kayak/ paddle boat launch, lakefront trails, and a lakefront promenade. The park will have a multipurpose lawn to serve as the city's special-events hub with the addition of an open-air amphitheater.

This exciting project will open in phases. Phase 2/3, currently in progress, will be completed during the first quarter of 2024. This phase consists of completing the final grading, tying in below and above ground utilities, construction of the Amphitheater, nature conservatory, wetlands boardwalk trail, shaded picnic areas, ballfields, multipurpose fields, skate/ pump track and other ancillary support services. This opens up the amenities of the east portion of Doral Central Park.

Phase 4 (the final phase) will be completed during the fourth quarter of 2024. This phase contains all the surface parking lots, and vertical construction components - aquatic venue and indoor recreation building. Additionally, the hardscape and landscaping is more dense in this area of the site along with more intersecting underground utilities. Planning, coordination and sequencing of work will take more time. This opens up the amenities of the west portion of Doral Central Park.



Mayor and Council Adopt Lowest Millage Rate in the County

During the second Budget Hearing Meeting, Mayor Juan Carlos Bermudez and City Council unanimously approved to adopt a reduced millage rate for Fiscal Year 2022-2023 at 1.7166. This will be the lowest millage rate of any of the 34 municipalities in Miami-Dade County for the upcoming year and the lowest millage rate ever in the City's history of almost 20 years.

"The entire nation is currently experiencing difficult economic times and inflation, which is why we knew that we needed to take action during budget process for the upcoming year to help our residents and business," stated Mayor Juan Carlos Bermudez. "I want to thank my colleagues – Vice Mayor Digna Cabral, Councilman Pete Cabrera, Councilwoman Claudia Mariaca and Councilman Oscar Puig- Corve – for joining me in this crucial decision to lower Doral's millage rate so that our community does not see a rise in taxes from the City."

Taxpayers in the Doral have historically benefitted from low taxes with approximately 13% of their taxes going to the City, while 45% and 38% goes towards Miami-Dade County and the Miami-Dade County Public Schools, respectively. Each year City leadership designates funds in the budget for giving back to the community. During Fiscal Year 2021-2022, over \$157,000 dollars was awarded to qualifying groups and organizations that include: small businesses, non-profit organizations and schools.

The Community-based Organization Grant is a competitive grant program intended to provide non-profit beneficiaries with opportunities to plan, develop and implement sustainable projects that will serve the needs of the Doral community.

The **Doral Façade Improvement Grant** program provides financial assistance to businesses, homeowner associations and commercial property owners in Doral in order to stimulate private sector investment, beautification, economic growth and job creation in the City, by improving the appearance of the buildings within City boundaries.

The **City of Doral PTSA Grant** program assists Doral schools in implementing educational programs that benefit their students. Through this process, the City may reimburse registered PTSAs for approved educational enhancement programs taking place in the current school year. The City also provides annual school supplies donation to Doral schools. The purpose of the donation is to help provide schools with a reserve of essential school supplies that can be utilized by students and teachers throughout the school year.

City of Doral Receives WCCD's Triple Certification on Data for Smart, Sustainable and Resilient Cities

The World Council on City Data (WCCD) has awarded the City of Doral with the International Organization for Standardization's newest (ISO) 37123 (Resilient Cities) certification. Beyond Doral's most recent ISO 37120 certification, and last year's ISO 37122 (Smart Cities) certification, Doral is the first city in the United States and Canada to achieve WCCD certification under all three standards within the WCCD administered ISO 37120 Series of Standards. This achievement further solidifies the City's commitment to harnessing standardized city data to drive a citizen-focused approach to smart service delivery.

"This significant certification further confirms our status as an international model city that is focused on transparency and data-driven decision making that yields results, "said Mayor Juan Carlos Bermudez. "By investing in these initiatives, we cultivate a safer more sustainable community for our residents and businesses."

The City of Doral has been a long-standing member of the World Council on City Data, first obtaining ISO 37120 certification in 2017 and annually in subsequent years. The certification process was spearheaded by Doral's Information Technology Department, with support from the City's Planning & Zoning, City Clerk, Parks & Recreation and Finance departments, as well as Miami Dade County Fire, Environmental, Solid Waste, and Water and Sanitation. All of these entities played a key role in gathering the data for reporting which was instrumental to the success of the certification process.

"On behalf of the WCCD, I am pleased to recognize Doral's most recent ISO 37120 and the WCCD'S newest ISO 37123 (Resilient Cities) certifications," stated the WCCD President and CEO, Dr. Patricia McCarney. "Having already received ISO 37122 (Smart Cities) certification last year, Doral has become one of only a handful of cities worldwide that have received WCCD certification under the entire ISO 37120 Series. Doral is also the first American city to achieve this important triple certification. This truly impressive accomplishment would not have been possible without Mayor Bermudez and Council's leadership and the dedicated, data-driven City staff. I look forward to our continued work, exploring how we can use Doral's year-over-year data trends to support the City as a data-driven community while driving forward Doral's continued prosperity and success."
