Honoring those who served & continue to serve

“One of the reasons I love you so much is you understand my sense of duty. Many men don’t believe in the fight we’re in anymore, but I do. I am a man that believes I died for something greater than myself. If you’re reading this it’s because I gave all I had for this country, my brothers, my family, but most importantly for you. I love what I do. I love everything my nation stands for. As I write this my heart is breaking . . . but I don’t regret it.”

The City of Doral honored all those who have served and continue to serve with a Veterans Day Parade and Ceremony on November 11th.

The parade began at Aloft Hotel, and headed east on NW 33rd to Veterans Park, where a ceremony was held. Parade participants included: 841st Engineer Battalion, Miami Vet Center, Cub & Boys Scouts Pack 552, Troop 552 Girls Scouts of Tropical Florida, Miami Music Project, our very own Police Department and many other enthusiastic organizations/groups.

Immediately following the parade, the ceremony commenced with welcoming remarks by our very own Mr. Marco Giron who served as our event speaker. Mr. Giron recognized the Mayor and Councilmembers, and welcomed Mayor Juan Carlos Bermudez to the stage, who gave a few heartfelt words regarding the importance of saying “thank you” to our men and women in service. After the Mayor’s moving speech, Mr. Giron read a letter sent to the City of Doral from Governor Rick Scott. Right after, Congressman Mario Diaz-Balart spoke to the crowd about how important the Veterans Service is for the Doral Community but most of all, the valiant labor they have all done to serve our country. Following his powerful speech, was Commissioner Jose “Pepe” Diaz, a Marine Corps Veteran, who talked to the patrons about what Veterans Day meant to him.

A beautiful rendition of “God Bless America” by the Loyola Elementary Chorus was followed by a powerful, crowd-moving speech by our special guest speaker, Mr. Michael Shepherd, a U.S. Army veteran who served

in Afghanistan as a scout platoon leader, earning the Bronze Star Medal and Combat Action Badge. Subsequently, Michael was an executive officer who led a 92-soldier reconnaissance unit. He is also a West Coast graduate, an eagle scout and an attorney at Carlton Fields.

Mr. Shepherd chose to not speak about his accomplishments, but of the brave men and women he fought alongside. His speech ended with a tearful reading of a letter from Mr. Shepherd’s late-best friend to his wife.

“One of the reasons I love you so much is you understand my sense of duty. Many men don’t believe in the fight we’re in anymore, but I do. I am a man that believes I died for something greater than myself. If you’re reading this it’s because I gave all I had for this country, my brothers, my family, but most importantly for you. Following his beautiful speech, Ralph West unveiled the plaque “The names of our Heroes who have fallen in the Vietnam War from Miami Dade County.” Mr. West spoke about his gratitude to the City of Doral for allowing him to donate the plaques that honor our local heroes and the true value of the service of veterans. It was a remarkable day of unity, honor, and tribute to our American heroes.

This reflective and powerful parade and ceremony honored our Veterans and their families for their tremendous sacrifice to ensure that we could live our lives free.


