ORDINANCE #2009-18

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY DORAL, FLORIDA, AMENDING THE CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS ELEMENT OF THE COMPREHENSIVE DEVELOPMENT MASTER PLAN IN ORDER TO MEET THE STATE MANDATED REQUIREMENT TO ANNUALLY UPDATE **ELEMENT**; **AUTHORIZING** SAID TRANSMITTAL OF THE AMENDMENTS FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF COMMUNITY AFFAIRS FOR **REVIEW UNDER CHAPTER 163, FLORIDA STATUTES:** PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICTS; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Section 163.3187 and 163.3177 (3)(b)1, Florida Statutes requires each local government to annually update the capital improvements element of it comprehensive plan; and

WHEREAS, the City of Doral has prepared a Capital Improvements Element Update (Exhibit A) and associated amendments to the Capital Improvements Elements of the Comprehensive Development Master Plan (Exhibit B), as required by Section 163.3187, Florida Statutes; and

WHEREAS, the associated amendments update the Comprehensive Development Master Plan (CDMP) per the statutory requirement; and

WHEREAS, the City Council believes it is in the best interest of the public to adopt the Capital Improvements Element update and the associated amendments to the goals, objectives and policies contained in the CDMP; and

WHEREAS, all public notice and hearing requirements have been satisfied.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF DORAL, FLORIDA:

Section 1. That the Capital Improvements Element Update and the Comprehensive Development Master Plan amendments provided in Exhibit A and Exhibit B respectively are hereby adopted. The Mayor is directed to transmit said Capital Improvements Element Update and the associated CDMP amendments to the Florida Department of Community Affairs, pursuant to Chapter 163.3184, F.S. for State-required review and Section 163.3177(3)(b)2, F.S., for annual Capital Improvements Element Update

processing.

<u>Section 2.</u> All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances and Resolutions or parts of Resolutions in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

<u>Section 3.</u> If any section, clause, sentence or phrase of this Ordinance is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, the holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance.

<u>Section 4.</u> <u>Effective Date.</u> This Ordinance shall be effective upon adoption on second reading.

CIE Objective 6: Continue to pursue grants, funding and other forms of assistance provided by the state and federal government for economic recovery efforts that will help the city develop jobs, retain employers and undertake capital projects that will enhance the community and provide additional employment opportunities for the city's residents.

<u>CIE Measure 6: Number of grants, loans or other forms of assistance obtained through</u> state and federal economic recovery programs.

<u>CIE Policy 6a: The City will include capital projects that may be eligible for economic recovery grants and loans in its annual update of the capital improvements plan.</u>

CIE Policy 6b: Efforts to identify projects potentially eligible for economic recovery assistance will be coordinated with Miami-Dade County, the City of Miami Springs, the City of Sweetwater, the Town of Medley, the Florida Department of Transportation and other public service providers serving the City.

CIE Policy 6c: An Economic Stimulus Projects table will be included within the Capital Improvements Element of the comprehensive plan. The table will be annually updated during the state mandated CIP update.
