This letter to Council is to inform the Mayor and City Council of the Doral Police Department Neighborhood Resource Unit's (NRU) continued community policing efforts in serving our community stakeholders.

The City of Doral Police Department will be hosting a Crime Prevention Fair at Doral Legacy Park (11400 NW 82 Street) on Saturday, December 2nd, 2017. The Crime Prevention Fair will be from 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. and will provide our residents information on the following items:

- Crime Prevention tips from the City of Doral PD's General Investigations Unit (GIU) and Crime Practitioners from the Neighborhood Resources Unit (NRU). The General Investigations Unit will also address current crime trends in the City of Doral.
- Scene preservation tips from our Crime Scene Investigations Unit (CSI).
- Options for alarm systems for both residential and commercial use.
- Lighting options for the security of both residences and local businesses.
- Sexual Predator information.
- Neighborhood Watch options.
- See Something, Say Something Campaign information.
- Hide it, Lock it, Lose it Campaign information.
- Public Safety Exhibits from local vendors.
- Lock (Sliding Glass Doors) tips to better secure residences.
- Citizen Police Academy Information.
- Step Up Doral Campaign information.
