Dear Ms. Menendez:

The federal tax return for Parks & Police 4 Kids, Inc. has been filed in the past based on the cash basis of accounting. Although the cash basis of reporting is an allow method by the Internal Revenue Service for certain entities, it is not a method under GAAP (Generally Accepted Accounting Principles). The compilation report however, has been prepared based on the accrual basis of accounting, which is a method under GAAP. The application of a different method of reporting between the tax return and the compilation report does not allow for the presentation to reflect the same numbers.

The Internal Revenue Service allows an entity to change its basis of reporting the entity's income and expenses based on various sections of the Internal Revenue Code and also pursuant to some Revenue Procedures.

You have requested that I provide you an estimate of the fees for the preparation of the required documentation to request a change in the overall method that it is currently been use to prepare the tax return, i.e. the cash basis, to the accrual basis.

I estimate that the fees for the preparation of the required documentation to request the change in the overall method of reporting the income and expenses from the Internal Revenue Service will be \$ 575.00.



AFTER SCHOOL PROGRAM

As per our last meeting, we wanted to explore the possibility of busing the children from the schools in Doral to two parks: Morgan Levy Park and Legacy Park.

I requested the quote of Air B Bus Transportation to get children from the following schools:

- a) Renaissance Middle Charter School (RMCS), Doral Academy Middle Charter School (DA), Shelton Academy (SA) and bus them to Morgan Levy Park.
- b) Ronaldo Espinosa K-8 (DRE) and Eugenia B.Thomas (EBT) and bus them to Legacy Park.

The quote came back as \$145 per bus per day which is completely out of our range. (Quote enclosed)

Given this I requested the help of Officer Noel Feliciano, we thought that we might then cover 4 schools, the ones that as per their knowledge need more support: RMCS, DA, DRE and EBT

While working on the calendars as per the Official 2016-2017 MDCPS I do not believe that 16 effective days of program per school will really benefit our children, plus the fact that these days in some cases are scatter around due to Teacher planning days, holidays, legal holidays, etc., the Calendars shown are marked in 4 different colors representing each school to give you the reality of the program.

If we want to cover more schools, maybe the best will be to cover only two schools, the two that according to our DPD we know have more need of this program. We need to remember that our School resource officers are in close contact with our children, and we need to trust them.

FUNDRAISING

During the Cultural Affairs Advisory Board (CAAB) meeting on Monday, June 6th, 2016. I proposed to have a Silent Auction during the Hispanic Heritage Art Exhibit Opening night that will take place on Thursday, September 15th, 2016 at City Hall. This Silent Auction will benefit the PP4K Foundation at a 100%.

According to the statistics of prior years, considering that we had around 30-40 pieces in exhibition, I believe that we can raise at least \$20K. Artists will be invited to donate one of their pieces for our Foundation.

Silent Auction was approved by the CAAB and will be handled by the Parks & Recreation Department through the Arts and Culture division.

We will also get our page in the Doral Digest through which we will acknowledge and thank all the artists that will be supporting our children every year.

MARKETING

Business cards quote is included. Quote is from the same vendor that prints the City of Doral's business cards and in view of the price and our knowledge of its work I did not considered necessary to get another quote.

Two quotes for our website are in the works. This website can include a page about our sponsors.

SPONSORS

While working on this, Juan Casimiro offered to sponsor us on an annual basis, together with a company with which he is collaborating. I, of course, accepted his offer on behalf of all of us and informed him that and we will get back to him as soon as we have our levels worked out.

I want to suggest that our Sponsor Program has as name: "Building Community with PP4K".

Police and Parks 4 Kids Foundation

After school program 2016/2017

After school hours are a critical time for youth. This time is either an opportunity to grow through quality after-school programs, or a time of risk to youth's health and safety.

According to the National Youth Violence Prevention Resource Center, every day, at least eight million children and youth are left alone and unsupervised once the school bell rings. While nine in then Americans think that all youth should have access to after-school programs, two thirds say it is expensive to enroll children in programs locally.

The PP4K Foundation has an opportunity to make a difference in our city by providing a safe, multidisciplinary and structured learning afterschool program to our children, by partnering with our public schools.

This is a program that has already been proved in our city. It has proven beneficial to our children and there are several cases that our Police Department well know of children that were "at risk" and that have changed their situations both in the academic and disciplinary arenas, children that are today healthy, successful and in the right path.

SERVICES PROVIDED BY THE SCHOOL

- 1. A curriculum and academic program will be provided and agreed upon between the Principal or designee and PP4K.
- 2. The Principal or designee will ensure that enrolled students will be provided a safe, supervised and educational environment that can be used as needed to serve up to 40 students, 4 days a week, for a TBD number of weeks, from school day end for two hours.
- 3. The Principal or designee will monitor de payroll for all MDCPS instructors hired to help implement this program using designated funds provided by PP4K.
- 4. A program budget structure will be created to help monitor all MDCPS payroll expenditures incurred while implementing this program.
- 5. The Principal or designee will utilize the "GO SALARY SCHEDULE" to determine the structure needed for a \$28.00 per hour instructor pay rate. Chart website enclosed: http://salary.dadeschools.net/salhbk/pdf/G0%2001-01-2015.pdf

- 6. The Principal or designee will have on hand student attendance records for reference.
- We will need, one PE instructor, one Music instructor, two MDCPS instructors for 2 hours a day, 4 days a week for a TBD number of weeks.
 (Recommendation is either a 64 days or 79 days full program for one school or spread it in two schools with 32 days or 40/39 weeks respectively for each school). Calendars are enclosed.

All payroll costs associated with this program will be paid by PP4K, Inc. Payroll associated with MDCPS employees will be managed using a district program structure.

PROPOSED BUDGET

Cost of 4 instructors per day (3 class instructors, 1 PE instructor, 1 music or art instructor)

- a. Hourly rate: \$28.00
- b. Hours per day: 2 hours
- c. Fringes: 0.1522
- d. Cost per day/per instructor: \$28.00 x 2hours x 1.1522= \$64.52
- e. Cost per day / 4 instuctors: \$64.52x 4 = \$258.09
- f. Cost for the program (64 days) \$258.09 x 64= \$16,517.76 Cost for the program (79 days) \$258.09 x 79= \$20,389.11

ACTIVITY INCENTIVES:

The City of Doral Police Department (School Resource Officers) in conjunction with The City of Doral Parks and Recreation Department will customize a sports program that includes organized seasonal sports and a music program that will motivate the students to stay off the streets. The initial number of students of the designated school will be 40.

There will be a closing ceremony in which the students will be able to showcase some of the abilities that they have attained during the program.

The DPD (Doral Police Department) and the PRD (Parks and Recreation Department) will require the use of the Fields of the designated school for an afterschool sports program and the use of part of the facilities for the music program. This program will keep kids in a supervised setting between 3:20 pm and 5:20pm and therefore off the streets.

All officers will be hired from the Off Duty pool of officers from the DPD.

DPD SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICERS (SRO)

Cost of 2 SRO per day

- a. Hourly rate: \$51.30
- b. Hours per day: 2 hours
- c. Cost per day/per SRO: \$51.30 x 2hours = \$102.60
- d. Cost per day for 2 SRO: \$102.60 x 2= \$205.20
- e. Cost for the program (64 days) \$205.20 x 64= \$13,132.80 Cost for the program (79 days) \$205.20 x 79= \$16,210.80

2% of this amount will go back to the PP4K Foundation.

SERVICES PROVIDED BY PP4K

The Doral Police Department through the School Resource Officers in coordination with the Parks and Recreation Department, under the PP4K Foundation guidelines will join forces with a TBD Public School to help lower the drop-out rate of students at risk, by providing input, expertise and activities that will promote positive attitude towards self, school and community.

The targeted students reside in the City of Doral. The following areas must be addressed if we are going to motivate students to stay in school and become self-reliant, productive, drug free, law abiding citizens: Attendance and Activity Incentives (Sports and Music)

These are some of the risk factors that are found in children at risk, according to the CDC:

Youth Violence: Risk and Protective Factors

Risk Factors for the Perpetration of Youth Violence

Research on youth violence has increased our understanding of factors that make

some populations more vulnerable to victimization and perpetration. Risk factors

increase the likelihood that a young person will become violent. However, risk

factors are not direct causes of youth violence; instead, risk factors contribute to

youth violence^{1,2}

Research associates the following risk factors with perpetration of youth violence:²⁻⁴

Individual Risk Factors

- History of violent victimization
- Attention deficits, hyperactivity or learning disorders
- History of early aggressive behavior
- Involvement with drugs, alcohol or tobacco
- Low IQ
- Poor behavioral control
- Deficits in social cognitive or information-processing abilities
- High emotional distress

- History of treatment for emotional problems
- Antisocial beliefs and attitudes
- Exposure to violence and conflict in the family

Family Risk Factors

- Authoritarian childrearing attitudes
- Harsh, lax or inconsistent disciplinary practices
- Low parental involvement
- Low emotional attachment to parents or caregivers
- Low parental education and income
- Parental substance abuse or criminality
- Poor family functioning
- Poor monitoring and supervision of children

Peer and Social Risk Factors

- Association with delinquent peers
- Involvement in gangs
- Social rejection by peers
- Lack of involvement in conventional activities
- Poor academic performance
- Low commitment to school and school failure

Community Risk Factors

- Diminished economic opportunities
- High concentrations of poor residents
- High level of transiency
- High level of family disruption
- Low levels of community participation

• Socially disorganized neighborhoods

Protective Factors for the Perpetration of Youth Violence

Protective factors buffer young people from the risks of becoming violent. These factors exist at various levels. To date, protective factors have not been studied as extensively or rigorously as risk factors. However, identifying and understanding protective factors are equally as important as researching risk factors.

Most research is preliminary. Studies propose the following protective factors: ^{2,4,5}

Individual Protective Factors

- Intolerant attitude toward deviance
- High IQ
- High grade point average (as an indicator of high academic achievement)
- Positive social orientation
- Highly developed social skills/competencies
- Highly developed skills for realistic planning
- Religiosity

Family Protective Factors

- Connectedness to family or adults outside the family
- Ability to discuss problems with parents
- Perceived parental expectations about school performance are high
- Frequent shared activities with parents
- Consistent presence of parent during at least one of the following: when awakening, when arriving home from school, at evening mealtime or going to bed
- Involvement in social activities

• Parental / family use of constructive strategies for coping with problems (provision of models of constructive coping)

Peer and Social Protective Factors

- Possession of affective relationships with those at school that are strong, close, and prosocially oriented
- Commitment to school (an investment in school and in doing well at school)
- Close relationships with non-deviant peers
- Membership in peer groups that do not condone antisocial behavior
- Involvement in prosocial activities
- Exposure to school climates that characterized by:
 - Intensive supervision
 - Clear behavior rules
 - Consistent negative reinforcement of aggression
 - Engagement of parents and teachers
