A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE NORTH DADE COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT DECLARING SPECIAL ASSESSMENTS SECURING THE DISTRICT'S SPECIAL ASSESSMENT REFUNDING BONDS, SERIES 2018; AUTHORIZING THE PREPARATION OF AND APPROVING A PRELIMINARY ASSESSMENT ROLL; PROVIDING FOR A PUBLIC HEARING TO CONSIDER THE ADVISABILITY AND PROPRIETY OF SAID ASSESSMENTS AND THE RELATED IMPROVEMENTS; PROVIDING FOR PUBLICATION OF THIS RESOLUTION; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the North Dade Community Development District (the "District") has issued its Series 2007A Bonds in the original principal amount of \$2,415,000 for the purpose of constructing and/or acquiring certain public improvements (the "Improvements") as described in the Engineer's Report prepared by Ford Engineers, Inc., dated March 5, 2007, as amended May 16, 2007 (the "Engineer's Report"), and as set forth in the plans and specifications available for review at the offices of the District Manager, Governmental Management Services-South Florida, LLC, located at 5385 N. Nob Hill Rd., Sunrise, FL 33351 and at Goldbetter, Inc., Office Business Center, 1031 lves Dairy Road, Suite 228, Miami, FL 33179 (collectively, the "District Offices"); and

WHEREAS, the District is empowered by Chapters 170, 190 and 197, Florida Statutes, to finance, refinance, fund, plan, establish, acquire, construct or reconstruct, enlarge or extend, equip, operate and/or maintain the Improvements and to impose, levy and collect the non-ad valorem special assessments (the "Assessments"); and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of the District (the "Board") previously adopted Resolution 2007-23, Resolution 2007-24, and Resolution 2007-26 (collectively, the "Assessment Resolutions"), in which the Board determined to construct and/or acquire the Improvements; and

WHEREAS, the Board adopted Resolution 2007-13 and Resolution 2007-17 authorizing the issuance of special assessment revenue bonds in one or more series, pursuant to which the District issued its Special Assessment Bonds, Series 2007A, in the principal amount of \$2,415,000 (the "Series 2007A Bonds"), for the purpose of financing the acquisition and construction of the Improvements, all pursuant to a Master Trust Indenture and First Supplemental Trust Indenture, dated August 1, 2007, by and between the District and Wells Fargo Bank, National Association, as Trustee; and

WHEREAS, the Board determined previously in the Assessment Resolutions that it was in the best interests of the District, its residents and landowners to pay for all or a portion of the Improvements by imposing, levying, and collecting special assessments pursuant to Chapters 170, 190, and 197, Florida Statutes (the "2007 Debt Assessments"); and

WHEREAS, the Board previously determined in the Assessment Resolutions that benefits will accrue to the property improved, the amount of those benefits, and that the 2007 Debt Assessments would be made in proportion to the benefits received as set forth in the District's Assessment Methodology Report, prepared by Governmental Management Services-South Florida, LLC, dated March 5, 2007, as Amended on May 18, 2007 and July 25, 2007; and

WHEREAS, the Board finds and determines that it is in the best interests of the District, its residents and landowners, to refund the Series 2007A Bonds through the issuance of special assessment refunding bonds (the "Series 2018 Bonds"); and

WHEREAS, the Board hereby declares its intent to allocate additional debt (i.e., in addition to the remaining unpaid par debt of the Series 2007A Bonds to the 176 residential units located within the District boundaries and thereby increase the amount of the special assessment lien imposed thereon; with the amount of the proposed debt assessments to be levied by the District on such residential lots to fund the debt service on the Series 2018 Bonds (the "2018 Debt Assessments") not to exceed the amount of the 2007 Debt Assessments; and

WHEREAS, based on the Engineer's Report, the Board hereby determines that the 2018 Debt Assessments to be levied on each residential unit within the District boundaries will not exceed the benefits to each such residential lot.

WHEREAS, the District hereby determines that the 2018 Debt Assessments to be levied will not exceed the benefits to the property so improved.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE NORTH DADE COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT, THAT:

1. The foregoing recitals are hereby incorporated herein by reference and made a part of this Resolution as the findings of fact of the Board.

The 2018 Debt Assessments shall be levied to defray a portion of the cost of refinancing the Improvements and will replace the 2007 Debt Assessments.

- 3. The nature of the District project referenced herein generally consists of the refinancing of the 2007 Improvements, as described more particularly in the Engineer's Report and in the plans and specifications on file in the District Offices, which are all by specific reference incorporated herein and made part hereof.
- 4. The general location of the District Improvements is on a tract of land of approximately 16.12 (±) acres, being situated in the eastern portion of Miami-Dade County in the State of Florida, completely within the City of Doral. More specifically, it is located in Section 29, Township 53 South, Range 40 East, and is bounded on the west by the NW 104th Avenue, on the north by NW 33rd Street, on the east by the Costa Doral Subdivision, and on the south by Lakeside Memorial Park, as shown on the plans and specifications referred to above.
- 5. The estimated cost of the refinancing the District's Series 2007A Bonds, including the pay-off amount for the Series 2007A Bonds and the financing-related costs of issuing the District's new Series 2018 Bonds is approximately \$2,150,000 (hereinafter referred to as the "Estimated Cost")
- 6. The 2018 Debt Assessments will defray approximately \$2,150,000, which includes the Estimated Cost, which amount includes financing-related and re-financing related costs, capitalized interest, debt service reserve and contingency.
- 7. The manner in which the 2018 Debt Assessments shall be apportioned and paid is contained with the Assessment Allocation Report for the Series 2018 Special Assessment Refunding Bonds of the North Dade Community Development District, prepared by Governmental Management Services-South Florida, LLC, dated May 22, 2018 (the "Methodology Report"), a copy of which is attached to this Resolution and made a part hereof as Exhibit A and which is on file at the District Offices.
- 8. The 2018 Debt Assessments shall be levied in accordance with the Methodology Report on all lots and lands within the District which are adjoining and contiguous or bounding and abutting upon the Improvements or specially benefited thereby and further designated by the Assessment Plat (as hereinafter defined), which Assessment Plat is on file at the District Offices.
- 9. The District Manager is hereby authorized and directed to cause to be made a preliminary assessment roll, as promptly as possible, which shall show the lots and lands assessed, the amount of benefit to and the 2018 Debt Assessment against each lot or parcel of land and the remaining number of annual installments into which the 2018 Debt Assessments are divided (the "Assessment Plat").
- 10. Any provision of this Resolution to the contrary notwithstanding, the amount of the 2007 Debt Assessments shall remain in full force and effect as the maximum amount of the 2018 Debt Assessments. The actual amount of the initial 2018 Debt Assessments will be less than the amount of 2007 Debt Assessments, and in no event will the 2018 Debt Assessments exceed the amount of the 2007 Debt Assessments.
- 11. Upon completion of the revised preliminary assessment roll, the Board shall adopt a subsequent resolution to fix a time and place at which the owners of property to be assessed or any other persons interested therein may appear before the Board and be heard as to the propriety and advisability of the 2018 Debt Assessments, the manner of payment therefor or the amount thereof to be assessed against each property as improved; and to authorize such notice and publications of same as may be required by Chapter 170, Florida Statutes, or other applicable law.
- 12. Pursuant to Section 170.05, Florida Statutes, the District Manager is hereby directed to cause this Resolution to be published twice in a newspaper of general circulation within Miami-Dade County,
- 13. If any Section or part of a Section of this Resolution be declared invalid or unconstitutional, the validity, force and effect of any other Section or part of a Section of this Resolution shall not thereby be affected or impaired unless it clearly appears that such other Section or part of a Section of this Resolution is wholly or necessarily dependent upon the Section or part of a Section so held to be invalid or unconstitutional.
- 14. In the event of a conflict between the provisions of this Resolution and the provisions of any other resolution of the District, the provisions of this Resolution shall prevail .
 - 15. This Resolution shall become effective upon its adoption.
