

# Doral Parks Bond Projects Update!

Since the City's incorporation in 2003, City leadership has envisioned world-class parks with many amenities that would be multi-generational, multi-purpose and multi-seasonal. Recognizing that the City is a flourishing one, the City is working proactively to help provide additional parks, facilities, and amenities to meet the needs of both current and future residents. A key goal is for all residents of the city to be within walking distance of a "walk-to" (or neighborhood park,) that meets the recreational needs of residents of all ages, interests and capabilities. That is why City leadership unanimously agreed to let the residents decide the future of Doral parks. On November 6, 2018, the General Obligation Parks Bond for \$150 million was passed by the voters. The approved bond funds will be used to fund the construction of high-priority, city-wide projects that includes increased green and nature spaces, development of Doral Central Park, construction of cultural facility and improvement of bikeways network and existing parks. Since then, work has been ongoing on all bond projects at varying levels, with improvements already completed on two parks and construction underway on two new parks.



## **Doral Central Park Groundbreaking**

On March 1<sup>st</sup>, Doral Mayor Juan Carlos Bermudez, City Council, staff along with Kaufman Lynn Construction and Bermello Ajamil & Partners broke ground on the Doral Central Park build-out project. The park will be closed to the public until further notice with Phases 2 and 3 scheduled to be completed in 2022 and Phase 4 completed in 2023. The 82-acre existing passive park will be transformed into a multipurpose and multigenerational park with amenities that include: a 70,000 sq. ft indoor recreation center, amphitheater, nature areas and aquatic facility.

The design of the park and the amenities included addresses the community's needs as identified in the Parks System Master Plan through community surveys and several community workshops that gave residents the opportunity to provide feedback. Following that process, the Mayor and City Council unanimously agreed that the residents should decide the future of our parks. Residents ultimately decided that they wanted projects like this to continue improving their quality of life.



# **Doral White Course Park Groundbreaking**

On May 4<sup>th</sup>, Doral Mayor Juan Carlos Bermudez, City Council, along with Waypoint Contracting, Inc., broke ground on the Doral White Course Park. This Park is located at 8429 NW 41st Street in Doral, FL. This new park will include a shaded playground, a waterfront event plaza, outdoor fitness stations, a multi-purpose green space area, fenced-off dog area, restrooms, and shelters. The park will have limited landscape lighting with general overhead and walkway lighting and security cameras. A new boardwalk will connect this park to the Downtown Doral area. The vision for Walk-to Parks like this (or neighborhood parks) is for every resident to be able to safely and comfortably walk to a high-quality park within ½ mile (a 5 to 10-minute walk) from their home.



# **Doral Cultural Arts Center Update**

Construction at the Doral Cultural Arts Center site continues to move along quickly. The Doral Cultural Arts Center will be located right next to Downtown Doral Park. This facility will celebrate the variety of cultures, arts, and experiences that make Doral so unique. Features will include a large art gallery space, a multi-purpose room, outdoor courtyards, area for catering, and public restrooms. The project is scheduled to be completed by the first quarter of 2022.






# PLANNING YOUR PLACE TO PLAY



SUN

# STEP 7

### **HURRICANE PREPAREDNESS**

To reduce hurricane damage, all new buildings must be constructed with hurricane storm shutters. Installation is simple but requires a building permit. Contact the Building Department at (305) 593-6700 for more information.

In the event of a storm, check TV and radio sources for up-to-date information. Know what to do in the event of a hurricane watch, warning, and/or evacuation order. Create a checklist for emergency supplies, know the locations of evacuation centers, and plan ahead for your pets. Prepare your home before a storm to reduce potential damage.

# STEP 8

### YOU CAN BUY FLOOD INSURANCE IN LOW RISK ZONES

Flood insurance is not just for properties in the floodplain. Did you know that more than 25-percent of flood insurance claims are for structures outside the 100-year floodplain? Even if your home or business is located in a low risk zone, it may still be at risk of flooding. Homeowners, renters, and business owners in low risk zones can purchase standard policies or reduced-rate "preferred risk" policies.

# STEP 9 FLOOD EDUCATION


Doral has many resources available to help you understand your flood risk and options for mitigation. If you want to learn more about flood risk as well as the benefits of mitigation contact the Building Department at (305) 593-6700. A City official can come discuss these topics with your homeowners' association or neighborhood group.

The City is also promoting education on NAI—no adverse impact floodplain management—to set local goals and reduce damages from floods. To learn more about NAI, visit www.floods.org or contact the Association of State Floodplain Managers (ASFPM).

# STEP 10 LID TECHNIQUES

Doral is encouraging homeowners and developers to take action to reduce stormwater flooding by implementing low-impact development (LID) techniques. Install LID techniques, such as rain barrels and permeable pavers, to help manage stormwater on site instead of allowing it to runoff into the stormwater drainage system, which can become overwhelmed and lead to flooding.

# HURRICANE PREPAREDNESS TIPS & RESOURCES

Hurricane season is officially here and the City of Doral wants to remind everyone that the time to prepare is now! Doral, as well as the rest of the County and State, are in the potential path of hurricanes. Which is why it is imperative that you review your family and business' hurricane and supplies plan sooner rather than later.

This is the third hurricane season in which the City of Doral Divisional Emergency Operations Center (EOC) is available to be activated, if necessary. The EOC provides a centralized space for City staff and first responders to gather critical information, coordinate response activities, and manage personnel during emergencies and catastrophic events to ensure an effective and efficient recovery for our residents and business owners.

With public safety as the City's utmost priority, all City departments are working diligently to provide the support you need to keep you, your family and your business safe during a state of emergency.



### **Pre-Storm Activities for Residents and Businesses**

• Review your emergency kit. Make sure to have food, water (1 gallon per person per day) and medicine for a minimum of three days. Visit the Public Safety page from the City website to see a complete list.



- Be sure to bring all front yard and backyard decorations, items, and accessories indoors to avoid the possibility of flying projectiles.
- Survey your property for any property maintenance-related issues prior to a storm, such as damaged fences, loose roof shingles or tiles, or other similar items so that they may be repaired before a potential storm hits.
- Ensure that hurricane shutters are in good working order and are being maintained regularly. If your home has hurricane panels, make sure all required hardware and materials are easily available and accessible.
- Flooding can be a major concern during a storm. The City maintains all storm water drains within the public right-of-way, but make sure that if you live in a private community, your association management maintains the storm water drainage system within your community. Ensure that all private storm drains are serviced and cleaned out to assist in alleviating standing water in roads and parking lots. Remember "Only Rain Down the Drain."





- Trim your trees weeks, even a couple of months, before the start of hurricane season to avoid having dead branches and pruned landscaping from becoming dangerous objects during a windstorm. Proper disposal of these items is critical to prevent property damage during a storm.
- For business owners in the City, all outdoor seating and tables, along with loose signs, should be brought indoors. All heavier outside storage materials should be properly secured, as well. City Inspectors will be scoping the City for construction sites and handling out flyers informing to secure loose construction materials. Have an emergency plan for your employees.
- Contact your Insurance Agent to ensure your property is properly insured.
- Contact your Homeowner's Association (HOA) to receive information specify to your community.
- The City's Building Department will be available to assist customers with any hurricane permitting and inspection inquiries. For flood information visit our website: www.cityofdoral.com, under the Building tab.





- Various major street intersections in Doral are equipped with portable generator interface devices that allow the hook-up of portable generators for continued operation of traffic signals in case of power outages caused by a hurricane event. Treat all intersections as a four (4) way stop when the traffic light is not functioning, or the Stop sign is down.
- In the event that your property is damaged during a storm, be aware of unlicensed contractors. Make sure to verify that all potential contractors working on your home are properly licensed, insured, and qualified by the State of Florida, and that all appropriate building permits are obtained.



- The City of Doral has contractors on standby ready to assist with clean-up and debris removal on City public roads. This will allow first responders to have unimpeded access in case of emergencies. In a continued effort to protect residents and business owners, the Code Compliance Department will be aggressively investigating and enforcing all reports of illegal contracting work performed in the City. Please know that if your community is managed by a Homeowners' Association (HOA), that HOA is responsible for their respective community debris pick-up and disposal at a designated Miami-Dade County Solid Waste facility.
- Florida Power and Light (FPL) outage and restoration information is available by calling 1-800-4-OUTAGE (1-800-468-8243) or through their mobile website at www.FPL.com.
- Cooperate with authorities if curfews are issued within the City and avoid leaving the house to drive around unless needed.

## Stay Informed!

- The City of Doral has the goal of keeping the residents and stakeholders informed. City staff uses various platforms to keep the public notified of hurricane emergency alerts.
- City residents and business owners may sign up to receive Automated Weather Alerts through Doral Alerts. This is free of charge and the application can also be downloaded on your smart phone. These alerts are pushed out to registered participants automatically, when the National Weather Service declares inclement weather areas near registered address. Residents and business owners may signup via our website to receive these notifications.
- The City of Doral uses these social media outlets to keep residents and business owners informed of any emergencies. There you can also find the link to subscribe to Doral Alerts.


# **COVID-19 Relief Food Deliveries**

Since the beginning of the COVID-19 pandemic, Doral Police, with the support and approval of the Mayor and City Council, has delivered boxed groceries to over 2,000 Doral residents. The program which recently concluded, provided important support to those in need of food due to their inability to leave their home or as a result of loss of employment.



### **COVID-19 Vaccinations**

The Doral Police Department spearheaded the vaccination effort in conjunction with other key City of Doral departments and the Florida Department of Health. Vaccinations took place at Doral Legacy Park during scheduled dates through appointments. To date, over 1,500 residents have been vaccinated.





## **AUTISM AWARENESS CAMPAIGN**

The Doral Police Department proudly supported a 27-mile long bike ride hosted by the Miami-Dade Fire Department to increase Autism Awareness with all funds collected benefitting the important cause. Over 200 people participated in the ride to show their support. Afterwards attendees enjoyed an Expo Fair with multiple vendors and a bike safety demonstration conducted by members of the Doral Police Department. Additionally, Doral Police officers wore specially crafted badges to commemorate Autism Awareness Month in April.






# Achievement Award from the Florida Green Building Coalition (FGBC)

The Florida Green Building Coalition (FGBC), the state's leading certifier of green residential and commercial construction and local governments, has announced the 2020 Annual Achievement Awards winners for Builder of the Year, Highest Scoring Projects, and Certifying Agent of the Year. The City of Doral has been awarded as one of the three finalists in the Local Government Category. The City has received Platinum Level under the Local Government re-certification.

## Doral ranks #3 Best Small City for Small Business

Go. Verizon.com just released their fourth annual report on the Best Small Cities to Start a Small Business. Doral has ranked as #3! Despite a difficult year for the small business community, the team at Go. Verizon celebrates Doral's ability to help its business owners persevere and thrive.

Rankings were based on data collected by Go. Verizon from nearly 300 cities country wide with populations between 50,000 and 75,000. Factors considered were percentage of residents with at least a Bachelor's degree, income per capita, tax score, etc.
