



CITY OF DORAL EMERGENCY ORDER No. 2020-08

Extension of Emergency orders 2020-04 and 2020-05

WHEREAS, March 26, 2020 the City of Doral issued “Safer at Home Emergency” Order 2020-01.

WHEREAS, under the of Section 1.04 of the City Charter, the Mayor and City Council have the broadest exercise of home rule powers permitted under the Constitution and laws of the State.

WHEREAS, the City Charter grants to the Mayor in a State of Emergency the authority to take actions as may be necessary to protect the lives and health of the residents of Doral.

THEREFORE, wherever feasible, City residents must isolate themselves in their residences, and in public settings subject to certain exceptions provided below.

Section 1. Remain at Home. Subject only to the exceptions outlined in this Paragraph 4 below, all persons living within the City of Doral are hereby ordered to remain in their homes.

Section 2. Gatherings. All public and private gatherings of any number of people occurring outside a residence are prohibited, except as to those exempted activities described in this Section and Section 4. This provision does not apply to gatherings within a single household or living unit.

Section 3. Prohibition. All travel is prohibited, subject to the exceptions in Section 4.



Section 4. Exceptions. People may lawfully leave their residence while this Order is in effect only to engage in the following activities:

- a) **Essential Retail and Commercial Activities.** Residents and visitors may engage in essential retail and commercial activities, including, without limitation, travel to or from essential retail and commercial businesses, as defined in Miami- Dade County Emergency Order 07-20, as may be further amended by Miami- Dade County and/ or further amended by City' s Emergency Orders. These essential retail and commercial activities include grocery stores; convenience stores; food distribution centers; restaurants (for take- out and delivery only, and subject to social distance separation of at least 6 feet between patrons); hospitals, pharmacies, and health care providers (including doctor's offices, rehab centers and urgent care centers); gas stations and auto- repair facilities; banks; hardware stores; businesses that provide postal/ shipping services and other office products; laundry service providers; childcare facilities providing services to groups of 10 or fewer (subject to limitations in County Emergency Orders); certain professional services; home- based care for seniors, adults or children; pet supply stores, veterinarian and pet boarding facilities; and offices in support of essential retail and commercial activities. Any business which is unable to consistently observe the social distancing requirements should close.
- b) **Outdoor Activities.** To engage in outdoor activity and recreation, provided that the individuals comply with social distancing requirements, including, without limitation, walking, hiking, running, cycling; use of scooters, roller skates, skateboards, or other personal mobility devices; or travel in a vehicle with household members to a location where it is possible to walk, hike, run or ride a bike, or operate personal mobility devices, while maintaining social distancing



practices. Indoor and outdoor playgrounds for children, except those located within childcare centers, shall be closed for all purposes.

- c) Religious Activities. Residents and visitors may travel to and from religious institutions and places of worship, subject to the City's requirement that religious institutions and places of worship reduce their occupancy to no more than 10 persons, and maintain a distance separation of at least six feet, as set forth in City's Emergency Orders, to promote social distancing.
- d) Personal Support Activities. Residents and visitors may travel to and from their homes to care for or support a friend, family member, or pet in another household.
- e) Work in Support of Essential Activities. Residents and visitors in the City may continue to perform work in support of essential activities (e. g., to perform work providing essential products and services or to otherwise carry out activities specifically permitted in this Order or any Order of the City, County, State or Federal governmental entity). Travel by personnel of essential retail and commercial businesses shall be permitted, including personnel providing essential services to residents within their homes, such as repair services, appliance repair, sanitation and extermination, landscaping and pool services, home care, or other essential services (as provided in Miami- Dade County Emergency Orders, as amended), provided persons engaging in these essential activities shall maintain reasonable social distancing practices.
- f) Observance of Social Distancing Practices. As to all activities permitted under this Order, residents and visitors shall adhere to social distancing practices, such as maintaining a distance of at least six (6) feet away from others, washing hands with soap and water for at least twenty seconds or using hand sanitizer, covering coughs or sneezes (into the sleeve or elbow, not hands), regularly cleaning high-touch surfaces, and not shaking hands. Residents and visitors are strongly



encouraged to limit all of their travel, except as absolutely necessary. Persons at high risk of severe illness from COVID- 19 and people who are sick are strongly encouraged to stay in their residence to the extent possible, except as necessary to seek medical care.

- g) Nothing herein shall limit or apply to any essential retail, commercial, governmental, or other operation or activity permitted under any Miami- Dade County Emergency Order or City of Doral Emergency Order.
- h) This Order is in addition to, and supplements, the County' s Emergency Orders. All requirements of Miami-Dade County Emergency Orders, and State of Florida Executive Orders shall be strictly adhered to at all times.

Section 5. Social Distancing. In order to ensure compliance with the CDC social distancing requirements, all essential commercial and retail establishments as defined in Emergency Order 07-20 which provide unpackaged food for consumption, including but not limited to those establishments listed in paragraphs (2)(b) and (2)(m) of Emergency Order 07-20, shall:

- a) limit capacity and monitor entrances and exits to reduce their maximum occupancy load by 50 percent in those areas where food is sold;
- b) close all salad bars and other self-serve food stations with the exception of prepackaged, “grab and go” items; and
- c) not distribute free samples or conduct tastings.

Section 6. Sanitation. All essential businesses are encouraged, subject to availability of necessary sanitizing products to:

- a) provide alcohol-based hand sanitizers for use by customers and employees;



- b) provide disinfecting wipes at points of entrance, cash registers, and/or other appropriate locations, for customers to disinfect carts, shopping baskets, or point of sale terminals, or, alternatively designate staff responsible for disinfecting carts, shopping baskets, point of sale terminals, and other areas as frequently as possible; and
- c) implement procedures for custodial or janitorial staff to sanitize frequent touchpoints throughout the day, including point of sale terminals at registers, conveyor belts, door handles, door plates, shelves, and other appropriate locations; and
- d) permit only one family member to visit a store at one time. Exemptions would be made for single parents, caregivers and other situations where it is not feasible to leave a person home; and
- e) when lining up at checkouts, customers must follow floor markings on where to stand in order to stand apart from other shoppers.

Section 7. Protective Gear. All essential businesses are encouraged to allow employees to wear masks, gloves, or other personal protective equipment. Persons choosing to use masks are encouraged to review and comply with the CDC AND Florida Department of Health guidelines on personal protective equipment.

Section 8. Facial Covering Mandated Except as provided herein, all employees and customers of grocery stores, hardware stores, pharmacies and restaurants are required to wear a form of a facial covering over their noses and mouths, at all times, while inside the grocery store, hardware store, pharmacy or restaurant facility. All individuals providing delivery services shall wear a form of a facial covering over their noses and mouths while making deliveries. All persons performing construction activities shall, at all times, wear facial coverings while on the construction site.



- a) A facial covering over the nose and mouth may include a face mask, homemade mask, or other cloth covering, such as a scarf, bandana, handkerchief or other similar cloth covering.
- b) In addition to the requirements applicable to grocery stores, hardware stores, pharmacies and restaurants, employees and customers of all other essential retail and commercial establishments are strongly encouraged to wear a form of a facial covering over the nose and mouth (as described above).
- c) All essential retail and commercial establishments are strongly encouraged to implement policies for employees to use other personal protective equipment, such as gloves, subject to the availability of such items.
- d) The requirements of this Section shall not apply to any outdoor activity permitted under any applicable City, County, or State order, except as provided herein with respect to persons providing delivery services.
- e) Nothing herein shall restrict any employee or customer from accessing any essential retail or commercial establishment to address any emergency or other exigent circumstance, even if a covering over the nose and mouth is not readily accessible at the time of such emergency or other exigent circumstance.
- f) Medical and surgical face masks, such as "N95" masks or other similar medical or surgical masks, are in short supply and should be reserved for health care personnel and other first responders with the greatest need for such personal protective equipment. Persons are encouraged to review and comply with the CDC and Florida Department of Health guidelines on personal protective equipment, including with respect to the use of a medical or surgical face mask, such as an "N95" mask or other similar medical or surgical mask.



Section 9 Failure to comply. Failure to comply with this Order shall constitute a misdemeanor subject to fines and imprisonment punishable as provided in F.S. §§ 775.082 and 775.083.

The Emergency measures that have been ordered and promulgated above effective are extended through April 30, 2020.
