The proposed ordinance provides the City with greater authority to regulate micromobility devices on their rights of way, as per Florida Statute §316.2128. Florida Statute §316.2128 authorizes municipalities to regulate the operation of micro-mobility devices and motorized scooters within their respective jurisdictions, subject to uniform traffic control laws, also Miami-Dade County Code § 2-98.3 establishes countywide regulations for shared mobility devices, which municipalities may further regulate within their jurisdictions.
