

Subject: **Alyssa's Alert**

This Letter to Council is to inform the Mayor and City Council about the implementation of Alyssa's Alert within our City's charter schools. During the 2020 Legislative Session, the Florida Legislature passed Senate Bill 70, and Governor Ron DeSantis signed it into law to provide an extra layer of protection in Florida's schools. The Legislature allocated \$6.4 million in recurring state funds to ensure every Florida public and charter school has this critical life-saving tool. In accordance with State Statute 1006.07(4), all Florida public schools, including charters, must implement a mobile panic alert system capable of connecting diverse emergency technologies to ensure real-time coordination between multiple first responder agencies beginning in the 2021-2022 school year. Such system, known as "Alyssa's Alert," must integrate with local public safety answering point infrastructure to transmit 911 calls and mobile activations. The Doral Police Department's School Resource Unit conducted a check of all City of Doral Charter Schools, and all are in compliance with the requirements of this bill.
