Subject: **NIBRS Comparison 2022 and 2023**

This Letter to Council (LTC) is to provide the Mayor and Council members with information about the National Incident-Based Reporting System (NIBRS) comparison from year 2022 to 2023, year to date.

The National Incident-Based Reporting System (NIBRS) is an incident-based reporting system used by law enforcement for collecting and reporting data on crimes.

The chart below compares 2022 and 2023 NIBRS from January to July for each respective year for the identified offenses.

Although the overall crime rate in the city has declined this year, we are proactively and strategically targeting certain offenses that have had a recent uptick.
