

In just 18 years, the City of Doral has transformed from swampland to a bustling metropolis and economic engine for the region. We were named one of the top 50 cities in the country to live in by Money Magazine and ranked as one of the All-America City finalists. We have also been recognized by Business Week magazine as the "Best City" in Florida for Business start-ups; named by Forbes.com as #2 of America's Top 25 towns to live well for its cultural amenities, probusiness environments and highly educated workforce; awarded Playful City USA 2010-2020, awarded Tree City USA 2008-2020; and named the third best place in the USA to retire by US News & World Report.

With 250 corporate headquarters and 100 multinational corporations, Doral means business. The city was rated the #1 city in Miami-Dade County with over 3,000 logistic-related companies supporting national and international trade and is home to Miami Free Zone, one of the largest privately owned and operated foreign trade zones in North America. Our population is highly diverse and well educated, with more than 95% having completed high school and more than 55% with a bachelor's degree. In addition, 90% of Doral's residents are multilingual.

Chief's Message




Without doubt, 2020 was a year that will go on the books as one where history was made on several fronts. A little-known virus that migrated from Asia, turned into a global pandemic that impacted our community and our department without distinguishing between men and women, young and old, and rich and poor. 



Doral Police Accountability

The Doral Police Department (DPD) has been at the forefront of national policing best practices. In 2016, the DPD was one of 15 law enforcement agencies to serve as a model for the rest of the nation with the implementation of the Task Force on 21st Century Policing. The violence and calls for police reform seen in 2020 police reform is similar to the outpouring seen in August 2014 after the Ferguson, Missouri unrest sparked from the fatal shooting of Michael Brown by police. A vigorous debate in the US about the relationship between law enforcement officers and African Americans, the militarization of police, and the use-of-force by police nationwide was the outcome. Among the current demands stressed by community members today are described below and have been in place by the Doral Police Department even before demand for changes were brought forth:

- Banning of chokeholds & strangleholds
- Require officers to de-escalate situations
- Duty to intervene
- Ban shooting at moving vehicles
- Require warning before shooting
- Bias free policing
- Use of Force continuum or matrix
- Public access to disciplinary records

- No ticket quotas
- No rehiring of fired police officers
- Mental health training
- Impartial police in-custody and police shooting death cases
- Critical incident review
- Early Warning System
- Body Worn Camera Program

The Department recognizes the need to rethink the training that police officers receive on de-escalation strategies and tactics. The Department's goal is to give police officers better tools for avoiding unnecessary uses of force. Use of Force Scenario based training as well as De-escalation and Communications Skills Training is being established and developed.

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Doral Police Training Section

The overall mission of the Doral Police Training Section is to maintain the highest training standards in professional law enforcement.

The Training Section provides the highest quality training through in-service training, annual recertification training, remedial training, pre and post police recruit training, and the running of the Public Service Aide, Police Citizens Academies. The Training Section also offers a variety of highly specialized courses pertaining to field operations, investigations, community engagement, emergency management and career development.

Additionally, The Training Section is also responsible for the training of civilians, who are hired to serve in various assignments such as crime analysis, communications, alarms, and records management.

To successfully accomplish the Department's training mission, the training staff has leveraged the latest training equipment, methodology and technology, such as virtual systems to enhance officer safety through improved critical thinking, de-escalation techniques, and decision-making.




Doral Police Department 2020 Demographics/Staffing

TOTAL WORKFORCE (SWORN & NON-SWORN): **211**






Total Male: **147 (69.66%)**


